Minutes of the Board of Health

June 14, 2012

ROLL CALL: A regular meeting of the Allendale Board of Health was held in the Municipal Building on the above date. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Robin Iversen, President.

The following members were present: Robin Iversen, Donna Fichera, Nadine Benoit, Maria Crean, Christopher Martin and Bruce Beck. Absent was Linda Morgan. Also present was Linda Quinn.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The May 2012 Minutes were accepted with a motion to approve by Bruce Beck and seconded by Maria Crean.

SECRETARY/REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Adult Health Clinic - There was no adult health clinic held.

Child Health Clinic – One child attended the Well Baby Clinic in Waldwick.

Vital Statistics – 3 Deaths, 1 Marriage and 3 Births

Receipts - \$84.00 in Marriage Licenses, \$75.00 in Retail Food, \$10.00 in Certified Copies and \$200.00 in Miscellaneous, totaling \$369.00.

COMMUNICATIONS/CORRESPONDENCE

-Nothing new has been received.

HEALTH OFFICER/SANITARY REPORTS

-The Atrium had high bacteria counts in two salads. Reviewed the lab results with the director. Have taken additional samples upon reinspection and bacteria content was very low.

-Starbuck's at the A&P was satisfactory.

-Clyde's - Performed a Chapter 24 and same was satisfactory.

-Visited all food establishments to check for outdoor seating. Informed Noshier Rye if they didn't come in, as soon as possible, a summons would be issued.

-Flirt Sushi has no outdoor seating this year, as yet.

-Restaurant L should not have any eating and/or smoking in the rear of the building where outdoor tables and chairs are located.

-The County was offering a vaccine seminar to get nursery schools and day care centers up in compliance with regard to required immunizations. Letters were distributed to them, however, getting parents to comply is an issue as they are not very responsive. It is up to the parents to go to the physician to get the vaccines and/or obtain an exemption.

-PM Concession stand at Crestwood Lake is open and they are satisfactory.

-Crestwood Lake has opened. Met with the DPW earlier and the lake director and everything is satisfactory. The water test results were satisfactory and, hopefully, the season will be uneventful.

-Bat incident in Allendale. The bat was captured and sent to Trenton for testing and came back negative. However, the child did begin rabies vaccination prior to knowledge of the test results.

-Super Star Camp had difficulty obtaining lifeguards. Reviewed the camp code with them concerning the number of lifeguards for 120 campers. Will follow up to make sure there are enough lifeguards covering the number of children that swim in the Lake. Camp Acorn will also be inspected.

-Regarding the Whitney I went today for their final inspection and met with the Pool Management Company. When I first spoke to the gentlemen from the Whitney I asked if they had all the necessary approvals from the town and he stated they did. However, the building department advised otherwise. Therefore, because final approvals were not obtained, they could not open as scheduled.

-A sanitarian was sent to inspect the Guardian Angel Carnival.

-Complaint received regarding Mezza Luna's garbage dumpster. Same was overflowing and had no cover.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

-The Well Baby Clinic will charge \$15.00 for any older child who is sent to the clinic by their physicians to obtain immunizations. The \$15.00 charge will cover administration costs.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

-The Board of Health has agreed to meet during the summer. Our next planned meeting will be July 19th at 8:00 p.m.

-Knox Boxes are currently being installed in the homes of senior citizen as a method of checking on them if they are not heard from or if they do not answer their phone. It is merely a safety precaution that is completely voluntary for senior residents and worth looking in to.

OPENED TO THE PUBLIC

-No one came forward.

A motion to adjourn was made by Christopher Martin and seconded by Maria Crean. The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
