**ORDINANCE 17-15 – AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, CHAPTER 233**

was introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, held on Thursday, September 28, 2017 and will be further considered for final passage after public hearing at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council to be held in the Council Chambers, Allendale Municipal Building, 500 West Crescent Avenue, Allendale, New Jersey on Thursday, October 12, 2017 at 8:00 P.M. prevailing time, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard.

A clear and concise statement of this ordinance is to amend §233-31 of Article VI: Unlawful Acts of the Streets and Sidewalks chapter of the Borough Code to permit the posting of temporary signs or other written notices if authorized by the Chief of Police or his or her designee for the purpose of public safety, as set forth in the ordinance.

**ORDINANCE 17-15**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE  
THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE,  
STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, CHAPTER 233**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 233-31 of the Code of the Borough of Allendale, be and hereby is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

§233-31. Unlawful Acts.

It shall be unlawful to post or affix any sign, advertisement, notice, poster, paper, devise, or other matter or material of any kind to any public utility pole, shade tree, lamp post, curbstone, sidewalk, or upon any public structure or building, except as may be authorized or required by law. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Chief of Police, or his or her designee, may authorize the temporary placement of signs or other written notices on any such public utility pole, shade tree, lamp post, curbstone, sidewalk, or upon any public structure or building as may, in the Chief of Police's discretion, be necessary or desirable for purposes of public safety.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that, except as modified herein, all other provisions of Chapter 233 shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.
