Before reading the proclamation, Council President Lovisolo shared her personal experience of suffering a stroke and spoke about its impact on her life.

“At our last Council meeting, a proclamation was read recognizing May as National Mental Health Awareness Month. May is also Stroke Awareness Month, and I asked if that could be noted as well. I thank the Mayor, Council, and our Clerk’s Office for making that happen.

Exactly one year ago next week, on May 28th, I suffered an ischemic stroke. It happened in Auburn, New York, exactly two weeks after our lake house burned down in the Finger Lakes. I mention that because the doctors believe the stress of one event may have contributed to the other.

Now, broadcasting that I had a stroke was not something I was sure I would have done right away, but my husband quickly spread the word, and I allowed him to. You see, his quick thinking and actions quite literally saved my life and, at a minimum, helped minimize the side effects of the stroke.

We had just completed a tour of a potential home to rent for the summer since ours had burned down, and I jumped into the driver’s seat of my husband’s SUV. I immediately didn’t feel right. It is hard to explain, but I felt lightheaded enough to say to John, “I don’t think I should drive; I don’t feel great.” He said, “Okay, I’ll drive,” and I moved to the passenger seat.

Once there, I had difficulty fastening my seatbelt, which caused my husband to take a closer look at me while I struggled. Right away, John said, “I think you’re having a stroke,” and that he wanted to take me to the hospital. He looked at me, and my face had drooped on one side, and I was, admittedly, drooling.

Now this is the important part, and I want to share something we did not know at the time, but I have since learned. Like most medical emergencies, time is of the essence with a stroke. If I had been by myself that day, I am not sure I would have taken myself to the hospital or called 911. I probably would have gone back and laid down to try to feel better. So, my message here is to listen to that inner voice—or God’s voice—and know your body.

On that day, I did not resist when John said he wanted to take me to the hospital. Something told me this was significant. With apologies to all the police here, he broke most speed limits taking me to Syracuse, which is normally about a 40-minute drive from Auburn. I think we got there in about half the time—the nearest major hospital in our area.

I sang the ABC song the entire way there because I wanted to keep talking, keep moving my mouth, and reassure myself that I could. Upstate University Hospital could not have been more amazing. They met us in the emergency department, wheeled me past a packed waiting room, and a physician immediately attended to me.

With a quick evaluation, they confirmed that John’s suspicion of a stroke was correct and recommended administering a TNK injection, which is used in the treatment of stroke to quickly break down the blood clot and restore blood flow to the affected area. In my case, that was the right side of my brain.

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There is a short window in which TNK can be safely administered, and because my husband acted so quickly, I was able to receive it in time. I was in the hospital for two days and experienced minimal side effects. Had we waited longer, or had the clot been even slightly shifted, I am not sure I would be standing here sharing this story today. I was very, very fortunate.

Life since the stroke has been about learning to adjust myself slightly rather than having to navigate life in an entirely different vessel. I am no longer the old version of myself, and that is okay. Setbacks have a way of forcing discipline in ways that may have been invisible to us before.

I feel nothing but gratitude and blessing to be able to read this proclamation here this evening and to share my journey so far with you. Thank you.”

PRESENTATION (1):

Councilpresident Susanne Lovisolo read the proclamation into the record:

A PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING MAY AS NATIONAL STROKE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, stroke is a leading cause of death and serious, long-term disability in the United States, affecting hundreds of thousands of Americans each year; and

WHEREAS, a stroke occurs when blood flow to an area of the brain is cut off, depriving brain cells of oxygen and causing them to die, which can impact speech, movement, and memory; and

WHEREAS, public awareness is vital, as knowing the signs of a stroke and acting quickly by calling 911 can dramatically improve survival rates and reduce the severity of long-term disability; and

WHEREAS, the B.E. F.A.S.T. acronym is a critical tool for recognizing the signs of a stroke: Balance loss, Eye changes, Face drooping, Arm weakness, Speech difficulty, and Time to call 911; and

WHEREAS, regular medical checkups, managing blood pressure, maintaining a healthy diet, and staying physically active are key factors in reducing the overall risk of stroke; and

WHEREAS, observing National Stroke Awareness Month provides our community with a dedicated opportunity to share life-saving education, support stroke survivors and their caregivers, and encourage proactive health habits;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, New Jersey, do hereby proclaim May 2026 as National Stroke Awareness Month in the Borough of Allendale and urge all residents to familiarize themselves with the warning signs of stroke and prioritize their cardiovascular health.

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PRESENTATION (2):

A PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING JUNE AS LGBTQIA+ PRIDE MONTH IN ALLENDALE

WHEREAS, the continued advancement of justice and inclusivity benefits all Americans and strengthens the foundation of our democracy, as every individual deserves to live with dignity, authenticity, and respect—free from discrimination, violence, and fear—regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression; and

WHEREAS, during LGBTQIA+ Pride Month, we honor the legacy of LGBTQIA+ trailblazers, mourn those lost to hate and injustice, and recommit ourselves to the work of building a society that embraces diversity and uplifts every voice; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Allendale is proud to be a Stigma-Free community, welcoming and affirming people from all walks of life and fostering a culture of inclusion, compassion, and understanding;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, New Jersey, do hereby proclaim June 2026 as LGBTQIA+ Pride Month in the Borough of Allendale and encourage all residents to reflect on the progress made, celebrate the contributions of the LGBTQIA+ community, and continue striving toward a more just and inclusive society.

ADMINISTRATION

Council Committee Reports:

Councilman Edward O'Connell, Facilities, Parks and Recreation Report: During Councilman O'Connell's report, substantial noise and commotion in the meeting room prevented the Municipal Clerk from clearly hearing all remarks. As a result, his report is not reflected in these minutes.

Councilman Matthew O'Toole, Public Safety Committee Report: During Councilman O'Toole's report, substantial noise and commotion in the meeting room prevented the Municipal Clerk from clearly hearing all remarks. As a result, his report is not reflected in these minutes.

Councilpresident Susanne Lovisolo – Finance, Human Resources, Administration & IT, Land Use and Construction Code Report: Due to significant noise and commotion in the meeting room during portions of the Council reports, the Municipal Clerk was unable to clearly hear and accurately record certain comments. Accordingly, portions of the reports may not be reflected in these minutes.

Councilpresident Susanne Lovisolo stated that that the Library has an adult program June 2, 2026, at 7:00 p.m., Jim wright will be discussing his new book at the Community Center. As always, check their website for all the wonderful programs they have coming up.

Councilpresident Elizabeth Homan – Finance, Human Resources, Administration & Information Technology, Public Works & Public Utilities Reports: Due to significant noise and commotion in the meeting room during portions of the Council reports, the Municipal Clerk was unable to clearly hear and accurately record certain comments. Accordingly, portions of the reports may not be reflected in these minutes.

Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale

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Councilwoman Homan reported that the Borough continues to monitor and address development activity occurring in Saddle River. She stated that efforts are ongoing to ensure neighboring municipalities understand the significant time and resources invested by the Borough of Allendale to promote efficient and effective outcomes for Allendale residents.

Councilwoman Homan also provided an update regarding the water rate case currently pending before Veolia. She noted that numerous meetings were held throughout the week and stated that she, Mayor Wilczynski, and Borough Attorney Raymond Wiss are actively advocating for the best interests of the Borough. She advised that updates will be provided as information becomes available; however, the matter is presently subject to confidentiality restrictions.

Councilman Yaccarino, Facilities, Parks and Recreation/Land Use and Construction Code Report: Councilman Yaccarino reported that he had several positive updates to share. He stated that Crestwood Lake is anticipated to open this weekend, subject to any remaining permitting requirements. He noted that all required inspections have been successfully completed and that Crestwood revenue is up by more than \$30,000 compared to the prior year.

Councilman Yaccarino further reported that Andy Agugliaro met with the new concessionaire and that there is a high level of confidence that the concessionaire will be a good fit for the facility. He noted that Recreation Sports Opening Day was held on the 9th and that the Borough continues to work closely with the Allendale Recreation Commission on various outstanding punch-list items.

As an additional update, Councilman Yaccarino advised that the Borough is testing a new storage solution for equipment at Fields 5 and 6. He explained that the metal storage boxes previously used at those locations have exceeded their useful life, and the Allendale Recreation Commission will be evaluating several replacement options.

Councilman Joseph Daloisio, Public Works & Public Utility/ Public Safety Report: Councilman Daloisio was not present.

Staff Reports:

Linda Cervino, Municipal Clerk's Report: Crestwood Lake membership registration is ongoing. The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, with polls open from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Election machines have been delivered, and additional election materials are expected to arrive next week.

Congratulations to the officers being promoted this evening. Thank you for your continued service, and I wish you much success in your new roles within the department.

Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale

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Raymond Wiss, Borough Attorney's Report: Borough Attorney Raymond Wiss reported that a meeting was held with Veolia that morning regarding easement implementation. He stated that seven separate conferences have taken place, in addition to a court appearance and numerous video conferences involving Veolia and ratepayer counsel. Mr. Wiss noted that these matters have required significant attention during the course of the business day.

Mr. Wiss further advised that Borough representatives continue to advocate for Allendale's position throughout the process and expressed hope that there will be positive developments to report in the future. He stated that the matter is progressing and appears to be moving closer to a final resolution.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Wilczynski stated that the Borough has developed a strong relationship with the Police Department and noted the important role the department plays within the community. She expressed satisfaction with the growth and progress of the department and stated that it was particularly rewarding to recognize and promote three members of the Police Department.

Mayor Wilczynski announced that the Borough's Town Hall meeting would be held on Wednesday, June 3, 2026, at the Community Center. Representatives from Congressman Gottheimer's office will be available from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., with the Town Hall meeting to follow. She stated that the agenda will cover a variety of topics, including a review of the Borough's budget. Mayor Wilczynski noted that the Borough adopted a budget with a zero percent tax increase and expressed pride in the accomplishment. She stated that this result was achieved through year-round budget planning, pursuit of grant opportunities, revenue generation, and innovative approaches to municipal operations, emphasizing that the outcome was the result of significant effort over time.

Councilman Yaccarino commended Mayor Wilczynski's leadership, stating that she has fostered a culture that allows Borough officials and employees to utilize their strengths and perform at their highest level. He expressed appreciation for her years of service on the Council and as Mayor and for her continued leadership of the Borough.

Mayor Wilczynski reported that the Borough is pursuing the acquisition of the Turner property, which would provide additional open space for the community. She also noted recent landscaping improvements completed across from the transit lot and encouraged residents to attend the Memorial Day Parade, where the enhancements would be visible.

Mayor Wilczynski further reported that a committee has been formed to evaluate improvements to the Borough's tennis courts and has met several times to discuss redevelopment plans. She stated that the Borough has secured three grants totaling nearly \$400,000 for the project. Proposed improvements include the addition of two tennis courts, three pickleball courts, and an adjacent basketball court.

Michael Dillon, Police Chief's Report: I'd like to take a moment to thank the members of this governing body for your continued support of our police department and the men and women who serve this community every day. Your partnership and commitment help ensure that our officers have the resources, leadership, and trust needed to do this important work.

Tonight we recognize and congratulate the officers being promoted. Promotions are earned through dedication, professionalism, hard work, and a demonstrated commitment to public service. Each of you has taken on greater responsibility, and this achievement reflects the respect you have earned from your colleagues and the community alike. Congratulations to the promoted officers and their families.

Finally, thank you to each and every Allendale officer for their service, support, and devotion to Allendale.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ANY MATTER: Walter Widmer, 38 Hamilton, inquired about the various road closures in the Borough.

Mayor Wilczynski responded that the closures are related to the installation of permanent PFAS treatment infrastructure. She explained that the two wells in the area are being piped down to the New Street treatment facility. She further stated that temporary treatment is currently in place while the permanent system is being installed, and that piping work requires roadway access and associated closures.

Mayor Wilczynski added that all but one of the Borough's wells have been fully treated and are now PFAS-free.

Mr. Widmer thanked Dottie Blitzer for assisting him with the Division of Motor Vehicle in the renewal of his driver's license.

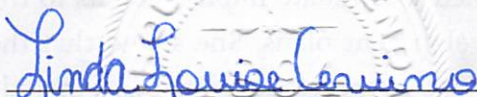

ORDINANCE #26-14

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, SIGNS, CHAPTER 270-20 (I) (6) ARTICLE V MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 270-20 (I) (6) of the Code of the Borough of Allendale, be and hereby is amended, supplemented and revised in its entirety to read as follows:

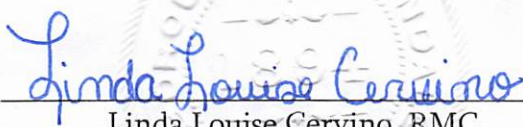
§ 270-20 (I) (6).

No sign shall be constructed of any material which permits the passage of light or allows light to be seen through the material so as to illuminate the exterior surface of the sign. Warm backlit signs shall be permitted and shall not exceed 2700 kelvins.

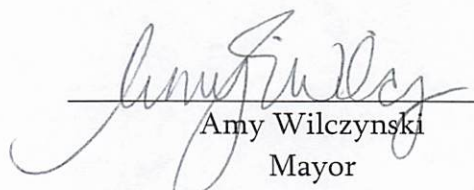
BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that, except as modified herein, all other provisions of Chapter 270 shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE CHAPTER 26, ENTITLED “ESTABLISHMENT; COMPOSITION; TABLE OF ORGANIZATION; CHIEF OF POLICE; DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY; VACANCIES AND DUTIES” OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 26, entitled “Establishment; composition; table of organization; Chief of Police; Director of Public Safety; vacancies and duties”, of the Code of the Borough of Allendale be, and hereby is, amended, supplemented and revised in its entirety to read as follows:

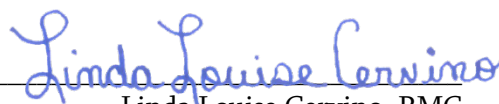
§ 26-21 Establishment; composition; table of organization; Chief of Police; Director of Public Safety; vacancies and duties.

- A. The Police Department of the Borough of Allendale is hereby established and shall consist of the following personnel to be appointed to these positions by the Borough Council in accordance with **§ 26-22**: not more than one Chief of Police or one Director of Public Safety, as the case may be; up to one lieutenant and up to five sergeants, up to 13 patrol officers; and four Class Three Special Law Enforcement Officers (SLEO III) who are retired regular police officers and who may, from time to time, be appointed and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governing Body for a term not to exceed one year, which officers shall not be members of the regular police force but shall nevertheless be under the control and supervision of the Chief of Police for use solely as school security officers as detailed in N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.10 et seq., as necessary.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that, except as modified herein, all other provisions of Chapter 26 shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.

PREPARE AND MAIL ESTIMATED TAX BILLS IN ACCORDANCE WITH P.L. 1994, C.72

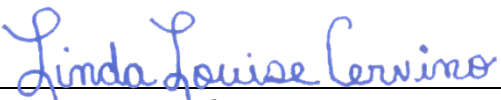
WHEREAS, due to the County Board of Taxation unable to certify a tax rate due to various issues at the state level and the Municipal Tax Collector will be unable to mail the tax bills on a timely basis, it has become necessary to issue estimated tax bills for the 3rd Quarter of 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Tax Collector in consultation with the Municipal Chief Financial Officer has computed an estimated tax levy in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, and they have signed a certification showing the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted estimated levies;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY ON THE 21st DAY OF MAY 2026 AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Borough of Allendale Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue estimated tax bills for the Borough for the third installment of 2026 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as necessary.
2. The entire estimated levy for 2026 is hereby set at \$49,258,421.70 for an estimated tax rate of 1.906.
3. In accordance with law the third installment of 2026 shall not be subject to interest until after August 10, 2026. Any payment received after August 10, 2026 shall have interest calculated from August 1, 2026.

WHEREAS, Mark Dunn successfully completed the promotional process for the position of Sergeant within the Allendale Police Department, including the required testing and interview procedures; and

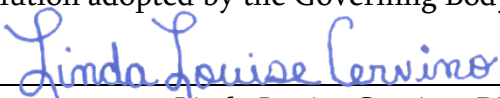
WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council desire to authorize said promotion effective June 1, 2026.
