Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season. We have been very busy at the Borough already. We had our annual Re-Org meeting on January 6th. The new Council committees are listed below. If you have a question or comment that falls into a particular committee, it can be directed toward the councilperson who chairs the committee. We are all accessible to residents to answer any questions or concerns, so don't be shy! **TRANSPARENCY** is the cornerstone of everything we do. Currently we are structuring plans and goals for the year per committee. We look forward to sharing these with the community and getting feedback at one of our upcoming town halls. The Council and I align with a common purpose: to make Allendale the best place to live for our residents.

Last year we had 4 town halls that were all well attended. We plan on doing this again in 2025. We still encourage everyone to come to Council meetings, but we understand sometimes a more casual setting is preferred. Be on the lookout for dates.

We are all excited to get the new community center fully up and running. We have been very busy at Borough Hall behind the scenes getting everything ready. We are all excited about this new space in Allendale and hope you are too!

The Fair Share Housing mandate and impending deadlines are currently what is keeping us very busy and up at night. We have been working with a team of professionals to assist us in our calculations of realistic development potential. We are also dealing with a second Saddle River development on our border that has plans to use our sewer. We are working with a team of engineers to ensure that our infrastructure has capacity and integrity.

Crestwood Lake will have a **new concession stand** by Memorial Day. The old structure has been demolished, and building should commence in the spring.

I am happy to announce that officer **Mark Dunn** is doing great. He still has a long road ahead but is up and walking with a cane. Please still keep him in your thoughts and prayers.

Once the weather gets warm, we are hoping to get the **mural project** back on track. It's sure to be a beautiful addition to our downtown.

Garbage & Recycling Reminders

- All items should be put out starting at 6pm the night before the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at least 4 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and not placed in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE ANY DEBRIS
IN THE ROAD: branches, scrap metal
recycling, cardboard recycling, bulk
trash, leaves, etc.

MOBILE PAPER SHREDDING



Give your paper a safe retirement - shred it!

Recycle your confidential documents such as, bills, receipts, tax returns, medical records, legal documents, etc. safely by shredding them. (Recycle magazines and non-confidential paper at curbside.)

In an effort to accommodate everyone, there is a limit of four (4) bags/boxes, weighing no more than 10 lbs. each.

Paper clips and staples are acceptable. Please remove binder clips.

Shredding performed immediately on-site.

***Shredding program will end prior to 2pm in the event the shredding trucks reach capacity.

ELECTRONICS & COMPUTERS



Recycle one "byte" at a time - bring us your electronics and computers!

Recycle laptops, monitors, cables, wires, speakers, computers, televisions, stereos, printers, and more!

TIRE RECYCLING



Give your tires one last spin - recycle them!

Four (4) tire limit, per delivery. Tires with or without rims accepted.


UNWANTED MEDICATION



Discard your unwanted and expired overthe-counter and prescription medications in a secured Project Medicine Drop box.

Bring medication in original containers or a sealed bag. Sharps and liquids will not be accepted.

You can also dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously, seven days a week, 365 days a year, at "prescription drug drop boxes" located within the headquarters of participating police departments. - Regulated medical waste, sharps, radioactive materials, and explosives

From the Allendale Green Team

The Green Team is pleased to report the success of their Holiday Sustainability Drives collecting EPS "styrofoam", Holiday Lights, and Electronics. The EPS drive on Saturday January 4 filled a truck occupying approximately 800 cubic feet of space and the material was then transported to Ridgefield Park for processing by our volunteers. The densified volume, which was approximately 5 cubic feet and weighed 226 lbs., will be sold to a manufacturing company.

It is important for residents to recognize the purpose of our collections - EPS is a plastic, which before densification, occupies an enormous amount of landfill space and never decomposes. We are conserving a significant amount of landfill space and turning the material into a saleable product. Electronics are processed to recover valuable materials such as copper and aluminum (sometimes small amounts of gold) and rare earth elements used in the manufacture of consumer goods.



We have received many hundreds of pounds of holiday lights and electronics to date and the final statistics will be provided in our annual report to the Mayor and Council at their January 23 meeting. We wish to express our gratitude for the overwhelming positive response from our residents and thank the citizen and student volunteers who have spent their time contributing to the sustainability of Allendale. A special note of thanks to Bruce Rohsler for his continued enthusiasm and generous assistance as the first Allendale business to partner with the Green Team.


