A Message from Mayor Amy Wilczynski...

May is a time for both winding down the school year and planning for summertime.

There has been a flurry of activities in town especially gearing up for 'Operation Crestwood Lake". The lake looks beautiful and is just about ready for footprints and memories. Be on the lookout for the Crestwood Newsletter if you are a lake member. All residents are welcome to our "Events at the Lake" concert series, the list of bands is posted on our website and social media platforms. We have also been busy planning for our new concession stand which will be in place for the 2025 season. The current building is still there but will only have the bathrooms functioning. The kitchen has been gutted and we will have food trucks on certain days to provide refreshments and treats. Thank you, Councilman Yaccarino, for your work on this project.

In our efforts to keep Allendale beautiful, we are making a commitment to plant at least 12 trees per year. We are starting with replacing the evergreens that line the entrance to the lake. This is in alignment with our sustainability and beautification goals.

The next phases of the streetscape project will extend along Central Ave and DeMercurio Dr. This project was primarily paid for with DOT grants. The flowers downtown just went up in time for the Memorial Day parade. We hope to see you all on the parade route starting at 9 and to be with us as we honor those who lost their lives defending this country. Thank you AFD for the refreshments afterward. It's always a memorable day in Allendale.

Our town hall series is going very well, we had our second one this month and are averaging about 40-50 people per. The last one was focused on the new Fair Share Housing legislation that Governor Murphy passed in a lame-duck session. It lays out our constitutional obligation with a series of very strict guidelines and unfunded mandates.

This new legislation creates immense challenges for municipalities that are already reeling in issues such as flooding, water pressure, crowded schools, etc. Our new estimated numbers could require Allendale to build up to 1000 new units. To get ahead of this, we formed a Fair Share Housing Committee and hired specialists in the "Mt Laurel' field to assist us as we navigate through the intricacies of the bill and timelines. This plan will ensure we are being proactive and smart about our options.

Councilwoman Lovisolo and I recently attended the NJ Conference of Mayors Meeting in Atlantic City. It was very interesting and productive with panels, speakers, and round tables designed to share ideas and suggest solutions that may be relevant to our respective communities. We will continue to stay current and informed about what is going on in other towns and the State and see how we can leverage some of the better ideas for Allendale.

On June 15th, 'Main Street' will be closed to allow local restaurants to spill into the streets for a fun, al fresco event called "Dine the 'Dale". This is a fundraiser for the Allendale Mural Project. Please go to our website for more information on how you can reserve a VIP table and how you can get your family name on the mural and be a part of history!





- 8 Orders for rain barrels and compost bins


New Materials collected this year were:

ALLENDALE HISTORY FRED LITT BOROUGH HISTORIAN

Allendale Hohokus Township 1876


Today's Allendale was put on the map in 1848, when surveyor Joseph Warner Allen helped to establish a train stop here. The train stop was named in his honor. At this time, Allendale was not an independent municipality. It was an area, informally called a village, that was part of Frankin Township.

Soon after, Allendale became part of Hohokus Township. The area quickly grew with new homes, a new schoolhouse, a post office, churches, and several dry good stores. By the 1870s, the Allendale community was known as School District No. 55. Recorded history from this time is rare.

Fortunately, in the 1870s, map makers were employed to create a visual history of Bergen County. Thanks to the Atlas of Bergen County, 1776-1876 (known as the Walker Atlas), we have a snapshot of Allendale from the 1870s as it began to take shape before becoming a borough in 1894.

Look carefully at the street names, homes, and buildings. Notice Allendale Avenue (now Park Avenue) and Second Street (now Brookside Avenue). The public school is on Franklin Turnpike. Today's Memorial Park is unnamed. Locate Cottage Place and notice (1) the home of Stephen Cable (today's Fell House) and that (2) the Episcopal Chapel was originally located there (moved to East Orchard Street in 1895).

GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at least 4 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the • curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need • to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and • NOT recyclable.
