Please see our 2025 garbage and recycling schedule for collection date changes around these holidays. Our website, www.Allendalenj.gov, has the most up-to-date collection information.

GARBAGE COLLECTION

Containers should be no larger than 30 gallons.

Receptacles should be set out after 6:00pm on the night before collection and be removed by 9:00pm on the day of collection. Please be aware that the truck may come as early as 2am the morning of collection.

Please refrain from calling if your garbage is not collected by its "normal" time. A number of things, including weather, truck break downs, detours, etc. may occur that could delay the contractor. The contractor has until 6:00pm to finish the route.

What is considered Garbage?

- Household kitchen, office and bathroom trash
 - Styrofoam Check www.allendalenj.gov for Styrofoam recycling events.
- Used Sharps Containers: place sharps in strong plastic container like a laundry detergent or bleach bottle. Fill 3/4 full and duct tape and label container "Homecare Needle/Syringe." DO NOT RECYCLE: place in garbage bag with regular household trash for removal.

BULK TRASH PICKUP

- Furniture Carpeting (should be rolled-up and tied or taped)
- Non-metal items (Window/mirrors/pane glass must be taped with an "X")
- TVs and other electronics cannot be picked up with garbage collection. Check www.bcua.org for the dates of their electronics recycling programs.
- x Wood pallets and construction material are NOT picked up.

SCRAP METAL COLLECTION

Once a month there is metal collection for BOTH sides of the Borough. Items acceptable for curbside metal collection are anything that is at least 75% metal, including:

- Bicycles
- Refrigerators* (remove the doors)
- Washers and dryers (remove the doors)
 - Cast iron
 - Radiators
 - BBQ grills minus the propane tank
 - Humidifiers
 - Microwaves
 - Treadmills

*Appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, etc., containing Freon or CDCs must be certified that the Freon and CDCs have been removed by a certified person or vendor, and a sticker (supplied by the removal company) must be attached to the appliance. This is required by law!

RECYCLING TIPS

- When recycling bottles, DO NOT leave the caps on the bottles - caps are thrown in the garbage.
- Leave plastic spouts on cardboard juice containers
- Recycle your clean and dry plastic bags and film packaging materials at your local grocery store.

DUAL STREAM RECYCLING COLLECTION

CONTAINER ONE: ALL HOUSEHOLD PAPER

All Items Must Be Clean & Dry Please use collection containers no larger than 30 gallons.

- Newspaper & inserts
- Cardboard boxes/press board
- Cereal, pasta, tissue boxes, toilet paper roll, paper towel roll
 - Junk mail, envelopes, office paper, construction paper
 - Brown paper bags
 - · Magazines, catalogs, phone books, soft covered books
 - Shredded paper
 - Non-metallic wrapping paper

Items not accepted:

- **x** Paper soiled with grease, paint, etc.
 - **x** Wax coated paper
- **x** Hard covered books (acceptable if the covers are removed)
 - x Greeting cards
 - x Empty soiled pizza boxes

CONTAINER TWO: COMMINGLED

Rinse and clean all food containers prior to disposal

- Plastic narrow neck containers with a recycling code 1, 2, 5
 - Aluminum cans, foil, metal cans
 - Green, clear and brown glass bottles and jars
 - Aseptic packaging (ex: soup, milk containers)

Items not accepted:

- x Ceramic plates and cups
 - x All Styrofoam
- x Window glass and table tops
- x Cookware pots, pans, bowls, utensils
- x Plastic bags, plastic wrap & plastic film (return to grocery store)
 - **x** Toothpaste tubes
- **x** Wire hangers (put out with scrap metal or return to dry cleaner)
 - x Aerosol cans
 - x Lithium Batteries

What CANNOT be dropped off?

- x Household garbage
 - x Bulky trash
 - x Scrap metal
 - x Tires
- x Automobile batteries
 - x Hazardous waste
- x Plastic bags, plastic film, plastic wrapping
- x Electronic waste such as TVs or computers
- x Clothing/textiles sheets, blankets, table cloths

What CAN be dropped off?

- Commingled recyclables (loose, not in plastic bags)
- Cardboard (place in garbage truck)
- Junk mail, magazines, newspapers (loose, not in plastic bags or tied)
 - Soft covered books (remove hard covers)
- Office paper, shredded paper (loose, not in plastic bags or tied)

ADDITIONAL RECYCLING OPTIONS

The Borough encourages residents to recycle other materials that are not collected curbside by participating in collection programs offered by the county and neighboring municipalities throughout the year. Information on how and where to recycle can be obtained by contacting the **Allendale Green Team** at **AllendaleGreenTeam@gmail.com**.

MOVING?

If you are moving, you must coordinate your complimentary one-time move-out pickup with the Borough Clerk's office. The pickup is to be used as your last pickup of garbage and bulk items and should be scheduled accordingly. Due to scheduling availability, please reach out one month prior to your closing date by calling (201) 818-4400 x 213 or email kimolivierieallendalenj.gov. There is a five piece limit of furniture.

Please be aware that items that are recyclable, metal, household hazardous waste, and electronics will not be collected. Please refer to the Borough's Garbage & Recycling Guide for appropriate disposal of said items. Please note that no garbage can be left out at the curb after your move-out pickup and should not be left for the new homeowners.
